RULES FOR WHITE HERON TROPHY

Competition: White Heron Trophy

Eligibility: All male or female members with a current official NZGA handicap.

Format: 4 Ball Better Ball Nett.

Teams of two players (select own same-gender partner), either two men or two women who each play their own ball for 18 holes under Strokeplay rules. All actual scores are recorded hole by hole then handicap strokes for each hole are deducted and the better net score of the two is entered in a third column of the card to indicate the team best net for each hole. The total of the third column is the team's score for the competition and should be entered in the result block on the card.

Team pairs must play together, mixed groups may enter in the same four (that is, two men and two women.)

Separate Trophies will be awarded to the winning men's team and winning women's team although play in mixed groups is permitted. In the event of two or more teams in either gender group having the same net score, the Trophy and any associated prizes will be shared by all tied teams

Tees: Men: Blue, Women: Yellow.

Entry: Players are to choose their own same gender partners. Both partner's names are to be entered on the start sheet in the shop and entry fee of \$5.00 each paid before commencing play. Both partner's names and handicaps as well as actual scores and adjusted scores are to be shown clearly on the scorecard to facilitate checking for the competition and so the cards may be used for handicap purposes.

Only one card with all details should be returned for the competition and for the first named player's handicapping. The other player must complete a separate card for handicapping and place it in the appropriate handicapping box.

All cards must show in the event block all competitions for which they are to be used.

Disputes: (if any) are to be referred as soon as possible (and in any event prior to results being announced).will be dealt with under the Rules of Golf by the Match Committee at the end of play.
